Omaha, NE (February 11, 2016) – Jim Lindsay, the first Chief Executive Officer and General Manager of Ag Processing Inc a cooperative (AGP), died February 10 at the age of 81. Lindsay led the Company for over 17 years following its formation in 1983. Jim retired in 2000, having led the cooperative from humble beginnings to the world’s largest soybean processing cooperative.
