It has been nearly three months since AGP received its first 2022 harvested soybeans. Certain pockets of AGP's origination area suffered significant yield losses due to dry conditions. However, yields in the majority of our trade territory met or exceeded expectations. In particular, yields in the area surrounding our Aberdeen, SD soybean processing plant improved significantly from the prior year. Higher yields in this trade area are very beneficial to AGP, as this region has seen a strong export demand for soybeans from the Pacific Northwest terminals. The stronger pull from the PNW exporters is partially due to the Mississippi River's low water levels causing higher barge freight and less competitive offers out of the U.S.

Gulf. Regarding quality, the new crop soybean allowed for a smooth transition at all of our processing facilities. Oil yields are on par with last year while protein levels trended lower.

On the cover of this newsletter is a picture of Aberdeen West, AGP's newest grain storage asset. Aberdeen West was acquired in March of 2022 with the purpose to supply soybeans to our soybean processing plant in Aberdeen, SD, or to rail soybeans to AGP'S plants in Hastings, NE or St. Joseph, MO, if needed. This was the first harvest operating Aberdeen West and the facility performed extremely well. Besides operating efficiently, Aberdeen West took harvest pressure off the Aberdeen soybean processing plant resulting in faster unloading speeds for our members.

In this edition of AGP News, you will find an update about the Port Infrastructure Development Program (PIDP) grant awarded to the Port of Grays Harbor this past October. There is also information on a number of international visitors and the recent promotions of two well-deserving AGP employees.

Finally, I would like to end by mentioning former AGP Director Dave Leiting was inducted into the Iowa Cooperative Hall of Fame in November. I have been fortunate to observe Dave's participation at AGP's Board of Directors meetings for many years. Dave took his position seriously and always looked out for the best interests of the Company and its members. Speaking on behalf of all AGP employees, congratulations on receiving this honor. We wish Dave and his wife, Lucille, all the best.

Happy holidays and I look forward to seeing you at our Annual Meeting on January 20th.

Matt Smith Asst. Regional Merchandising Manager



POGH Secures \$25 Million Grant



Several months ago, AGP leaders traveled to Washington, D.C. to advocate for a federal grant supporting new investment at the Port of Grays Harbor (POGH) in Aberdeen, WA. Recently, the United States Department of **Transportation Maritime Administration** (MARAD) awarded POGH a \$25.5 million Port Infrastructure Development Program (PIDP) grant for the Terminal 4 Expansion & Redevelopment Project. The grant will be matched by \$21.35 million in non-federal funds.

The PIDP is a discretionary grant program administered by MARAD. Funds for the PIDP are awarded on a competitive basis to projects that improve the safety, efficiency, or reliability of the movement of goods at

a port. More than \$684 million of funding was available to make awards under the FY2022 PIDP grant program. POGH submitted an application for the Terminal 4 Expansion & Redevelopment Project in May 2022.

The PIDP grant is critical to the Port's ability to accommodate AGP's growth and attract private investment. Soybean meal supply is expected to increase as a result of the growing demand for its co-product, soybean oil, as a feedstock for the renewable fuel industry. Increased soybean meal production will require the development of new international markets. AGP intends to construct a second ship loader and high speed rail receiving building at POGH Terminal 4 to supply new export destinations. Once complete, the project will double AGP's soybean meal export capacity. To support the second transload facility, POGH will add 50,000 feet of rail to allow for efficient unloading, railcar storage, and unit train assembly. The Terminal 4 Expansion and Redevelopment Project grant will also allow POGH to: repurpose a former pontoon construction site into a cargo laydown area, make access and roadway improvements, and replace the marine terminal fendering and stormwater systems. The project will bolster the local economy, benefit farmers across the Midwest by opening new markets, and create significant new job opportunities. The project and POGH's grant application received widespread support from farmers, state and national soybean associations, and leaders at all levels throughout the Midwest and Pacific Northwest.

"We are incredibly grateful to our federal delegation and their staffs, who truly understand the importance of strategic transportation investment, for all of their support and leadership in securing this critical funding for the Terminal 4 Expansion & Redevelopment Project," said POGH Commission President Tom Quigg. "This project will allow us to accommodate AGP's growth and private investment here in Grays Harbor, increase international shipments of U.S. grown and processed soybean meal, and sustain thousands of farming jobs throughout the Midwest. This is not just a project of regional significance, but truly a project of national significance."

"The widespread, bi-partisan support we received for this grant application was extraordinary," said POGH Executive Director Gary Nelson. "We received strong support from our local and tribal leaders, to Governors and U.S. Senators and Representatives throughout the Midwest. This infrastructure project will play a critical role in the United States economy for decades to come. We look forward to having this project be a poster child for PIDP by showcasing how investment in public infrastructure can leverage benefits like private investment, job creation, and opportunities for communities across our nation."

Featured Entertainment **Josh Turner**




For two decades, Josh Turner's trademark deep voice has been one of the most recognizable on country radio. He broke onto the scene with 2003's "Long Black Train" and quickly established himself as a country traditionalist in an era that saw the genre shifting more toward pop music. He would go on to incorporate elements of modern country music in the mid-2000s hits

"Would You Go with Me?" and "Your Man." That garnered Turner Grammy nominations for Best Country Album and Best Male Country Vocal Performance, and helped him gain induction to the Grand Ole Opry in 2007.

More recently, his career has seen him find crossover success on Christian radio, and as a guest mentor on American Idol. All total, Turner has released nine albums, with three reaching the number one spot on *Billboard*'s Top Country Albums. His most-recent record, titled King Size Manger, is a collection of Christmas classics and was released in 2021.
